



## <u>CORONAVIRUS UPDATES AND PROCESSES – September 2021</u>

## COVID – 19 SYMPTOMS

- Where a pupil develops coronavirus symptoms at home (a new, continuous cough, a high temperature or a loss of or change to their sense of taste and/or smell), they should not come into school, self-isolate and take a PCR test.
- If a child develops symptoms in school, they will be isolated and we shall phone home to let you know. Your child would need to be collected and taken for a PCR test.
- If the PCR test comes back positive, pupils must self-isolate for 10 days from their first symptoms.
- If a lateral flow test has been taken and shows a positive result, a PCR needs to be taken within 2 days and the pupil would need to self-isolate until the result comes back. A negative PCR test would end the isolation period.

## **CONTACT TRACING**

- Contact tracing is no longer necessary in a school setting.
- NHS Test and Trace will contact parents directly to identify close contacts.

## **CLOSE CONTACTS**

- Children who are under the age of 18 years and 6 months do not need to self-isolate if they live in the same household as someone with Covid-19 or a close contact.
- Close contacts will be informed by NHS Test and Trace that they have been in close contact with a positive case.
- They will be advised to take a PCR test in order to keep those around them safe.
- There is no requirement to self-isolate while awaiting this result and so pupils would be able to come to school as usual.
- Close contacts who are under 5 years old will only be advised to take a PCR test if the
  positive case is within their own household.
